



"Let's Discover Europe Together Finding Harmony in Differences – "EUROPE'S FRIENDS", 2017-1-RO01-KA219-037409_1

The second international camp for students, belonging to the project "Let's Discover Europe Together Finding Harmony in Differences - EUROPE'S FRIENDS" no. 2017-1-RO01-KA219-037409_1, action KA2 — entitled UNESCO Heritage, took place in Anoixi, Greece, from May 6th to May 15th 2019, and was organized by the partner institution in the project, "Gymnasio Anoixi, from Anoixi, Greece.

- **The theme** of the camp was the **UNESCO Heritage from each partner country**.
- > 5 target groups were established, each made up of 7 students;
- 14 hearing-impaired students from the schools in Poland and Romania, middle school level, aged between 12 and 16;
- 21 students without special educational needs, from the schools in Greece, Portugal and Turkey, aged between 12 and 18;
- 10 teaching staff from the 5 partner schools.


Sunday, May 5th, 2019

- The national teams from Romania, Poland, Turkey and Portugal arrived at the "Anoixi" camp hotel, in Anoixi, Greece, on Sunday, May, 5th, 2019.
- The 4 teams were met at the airport by the project coordinator in Greece, Mrs. Grammatiki Palamouti and the school principal, Mrs. Eleni Kremmyda (timetable 12:00 18:30).
- After room accommodation, the teams had free time to meet one another and socialize. Dinner was served at around 19:00hrs, after which the children continued to get acquainted and communicate with each other, till bedtime (22:00hrs).
- The teachers had their **first meeting** from 20:00 to 22:00hrs, with information on the camp program, the individual tasks to perform in the camp, and the students' tasks.


Ziua 1

Monday, May 6th, 2019

- The day began with **Energizer exercise** performed outdoors, on the hotel green, from 7:15 to 7:30 and the breakfast served in the hotel dining room, from 7:30 to 8:30.
- At 8:30 there took place the **Camp opening festivity** of the second camp belonging to the project EUROPE'S FRIENDS, at Gymnasio Anoixis, in Anoixis, Greece. The school principal, Mrs. Eleni Kremmyda, the deputy principal, Mr. Dimitris Karkoglou and, on behalf of the City Council of Anoixis, Mr. Panagiotis Isoukas.
- Next, the Greek students presented a **Welcome show** for the project partners. The day went on with a suite of **traditional dances** presented by the students







• The camp meeting was opened at 10:30 by Mrs. Grammatiki Palamouti and Eleni Kremmyda, who explained the Camp Rules which must be observed both by the students and the teachers; after that, they organized the camp participants into 5

multinational teams, led by 5 guide-teachers, who would supervise them during activities and workshops. Participants were given white caps with the name of Greece printed in different

colors (red, purple, blue, green and orange) and badges, for identification. Each coordinator from the 4 partner countries: Romania, Poland, Portugal and Turkey received a folder containing pens, note pad, 2 maps of Greece and Athens, flyers/presentation brochures about the host country. Each participant institution had to print at home its own copies of the **Camp Journal**, written by the Greek and Romanian teams.









- The students and accompanying teachers received the **Initial evaluation questionnaires** for the mobility which contained questions related to the activities to be accomplished in the camp, what the students wanted to learn during the camp, the reasons why they wished to participate in this camp.
- After the lunch break (at which they served **traditional Greek food** prepared by the students' parents), each team presented **a promotion material** of each partner school in the project, as well as a small exhibition with products made during their activities.
- The day continued with **traditional games** prepared by the students in each partner school. Each team briefly presented the game rules and made demonstrations.
- After a short break, students reunited in the initial teams and started to fill in the first pages of the **Camp Journal** together. The teachers offered help, mainly to the hearing-impaired students, in sign language.
- The day ended with the **international cuisine exhibition**, where each team displayed, at own stand, traditional foods and sweets specific to their country. Students were wearing **folk costumes** and competed in promoting their traditional products. The stands were decorated with national flags and other ornaments. The students presented the various sorts of foods and sweets to the visitors and invited them to taste them.









• The teachers' meeting was held from 21:00 to 22:00. They discussed the next day's program and made an evaluation of the current activities.

Day 2 Tuesday, May 7th, 2019

- The day began with **Energizer exercise** performed outdoors, on the hotel green, from 7:15 to 7:30 and the breakfast served in the hotel dining room, from 7:30 to 8:30.
- The morning activities comprised **Lesson 1** from 8:30 to 9:30 and **Lesson 2** from 9:30 to 10:30; there were mixed teams, with students from each partner country. The two lessons had the goal of presenting the UNESCO heritage in each partner country, according to the Guidebooks written by each of the 5 countries: Romania, Greece, Poland, Portugal, Turkey Lesson 1 about the country's specific heritage and Lesson 2, as a continuation of the learning activity, consisting in making up folders with the acquired information and the material found on the Internet on this subject.





After a short break, students took part in the arts and crafts workshops where each group coordinator presented the making of a product specific to the country he belonged to; then, each student from the respective group practised and finally made the respective product, under the coordination of the group leader: Poland – the purple team – Pottery painting, Romania - the orange team - Bracelets, Greece – the blue team – Olive tree, Portugal – the



green team – Embroidery/the Rooster, Turkey – the red team – Falyo kabartna.

• The program continued with the learning of the verses specially composed for the Erasmus Camp song, and the practising of the the Traditional games prepared by each group leader (Portugal, Romania, Turkey, Greece, Poland). Each group coordinator presented a game



specific to the country they belong to and its rules, then each group played the game, under the coordination of the group leader: Poland the purple team - the Swan, Romania - the orange team - Country, country, we want soldiers!, Greece - the blue team - Pity, Portugal - the green team - Rope pulling, Turkey – the red team– 9 kiremit.

• After the lunch offered by the host school, students took part in a workshop at the Museum of Anoixis. Participant students took photos in the town, which they processed and

added specific messages for the photovoice exhibition. Next were the traditional dance lessons and rehearsals (Poland, Portugal, Romania, Greece, Turkey).

- During the break, the teams continued to write in the Camp journal, exchanged information, with the assistance of their teachers and their older team mates.
 - The evening ended with dinner, where they served traditional Greek foods.
- At the evening meeting, the teachers made an analysis of the day's activities and evaluations and discussed the next day's program.

> Day 3

Wednesday, May 8th, 2019

- At 8:30, after Energizer and breakfast, the morning activities comprised **Lesson 3** from 8:30 to 9:30 and Lesson 4 from 9:30 to 10:30; the teams worked by rotation, so that the same lesson was presented to another team, until all the five teams came to know the UNESCO Heritage in all the five countries (Poland, Portugal, Romania, Turkey, Greece).
- At 10:30, the host teachers, together with the students from the other countries and their teachers started on a thematic trip to The Technological and Industrial Educational Museum in Lavrio. Here, the students and teachers participated in a workshop with the theme "Rock, Mineral, Ore" and learnt information related to the technology of ore extraction, their physicalchemical properties, identified the differences between rocks, minerals and metals, worked in teams, mapped the extraction centers, filled in the worksheets and then presented orally the solutions to the tasks.







- Next we went to visit the Temple of Poseidon at Souni, one of the sites in the UNESCO Heritage of Greece, where the students received explanations, made lots of photos, individually or in groups or teams.
- After lunch, the students and teachers took part in workshops organized at the host school: Traditional games (Greece, Romania), Traditional dances, Photography, Erasmus Camp song.
- Dinner was at 19:00 hrs, after which the children had time to socialize, play, share experience in practising sign language, take group photos.
- The teachers' meeting and evaluation were held as planned, from 21:00 to 22:00hrs.

Day 4 Thursday, May 9th, 2019

- .At 8:30, after Energizer and breakfast, themorning activities began with **rehearsing the traditional dances** specific to each country. Under the teachers' coordination, the students practised in the schoolyard, together with other students from the host school who had joined the camp participants; they did Greek, Romanian, Polish, Turkish and Portuguese dances.
- After a shortbreak, the day's program continued with **Lesson 5** and **Lesson 6**, about the UNESCO Heritage of each country.
- The teachers and students had lunch at a **Greek taverna**, "Pepinos", where they could taste traditional foods specific to the host country. The owner of the taverna had set the tables with the flags of each country and presented the products/ foods he had specially prepared. He asked the students various questions about the countries they had come from and their customs and traditions, as well as about the places worth seeing and visiting. Mention was made of the fact that
- people celebrate *Europe's International Day* on the *9th of May*, and our being there at that moment was the proof that we belong to Europe, we are united in friendship and Europe is one and the same for us all. After lunch, the host checked the students' knowledge on Greek foods and was very happy seeing that they had remembered their names and had liked everything he had prepared for them.
- On coming back to Anoixi, the students had some free time, resumed filling in their Camp journal, then rehearsed together the **Erasmus Camp song** and **took pictures with the natural background and group photos**.
- The afternoon program continued with arts and crafts workshops. The students learned how to recycle paper and make nice-looking products from paper scraps. Each student made a mock-up representing a piece of nature. They also participated in a debate about saving the environment and keeping it clean, healthy and beautiful, to ensure continuity of life on Earth.
- Dinner was served in the school, in the form of a buffet, then the children had time to socialize, play, exchange experience in practising sign language.





• The teachers' meeting and evaluation were held at the hotel. They discussed the activities carried out during the day and presented the next day's activities. Mrs. Grammatiki Palamouti informed the teachers on the students' dress and behavior during the trip to Athens, where they were to visit the Parliament of Greece.

<u>Day 5</u>Friday, May 10th, 2019

• For the fifth camp day, the hosts had organized a wonderful trip tp the country's capital, Athens, the place where most of the sights of the UNESCO Greek Heritage are: the Acropolis, Parthenon, Temple of Athens, the museum of Acropolis, the Caryatids, the Erechteion, the historical center of Athens, the Sintagma Square. The students received a lot of information, asked questions, took lots of





photos, individual, team and group photos.

- Lunch was served in the historical center of Athens, then students could do some shopping and buy souvenirs for their parents and friends at home.
- In the afternoon, we had the honor to be received at **the Parliament of Greece**. After the visit, we took part in **a workshop about the history of Greece**. The mediator of this workshop, very well prepared professionally, very sociable, showed great

teaching skill and tact in presenting the history of Greece in a very pleasant, non-formal manner, interactive and fun at the same time. The students were given much information on the formation of the Parliament, the way it works, how the constitution of a country is made, how laws are made. The students also presented aspects of each country's parliament and history. They mentioned the

fact that Romania is at the leadership of the European Parliament at present. We were honored and thrilled to be witnessing **the work of the members of the Parliament** for 30 minutes. The leadership of the Parliament informed its members on our presence there, on the Erasmus program and the objectives of the project and of our visit. **These moments have been recorded by the television** staff present and broadcast on **the national station** the same evening:

The day ended with dinner and the practising of the camp song, as well as the filling in of the camp journals and **the teachers' meeting** for the evaluation of the day's activities.





<u>Day 6</u> Saturday, May 11th, 2019

- After performing the Energizer and having breakfast, the group of 35 students and 9 teachers participating in the camp in Greece, along with the representatives of the host country, started on a **thematic hiking trip** to Mount Parnitha, where they played in outdoor games
- Each group coordinator presented a game specific to his/her countryand its rules and then each group played that game, under the coordination of the group leader: Poland the purple team Rope jumping, Romania the orange team the Castle, Greece the blue team Mantili, Portugal the green team Egg spoons, Turkey the red team Kenkli istop.
- This trip has been both work and fun for the participants, and contributed to their physical training and sporty spirit.
 - Lunch was in picnic style.
- On coming back to Anoixi, the students had free time to rehearse **the Erasmus camp** song, wrote in their camp journals, practised sign language, and then the teams had **Photography workshops**.



- The evening ended in a special manner, with a party in which traditional dances combined with modern music and dances. Children learned each country's dances, taking turns. They sang and danced without barriers. The hosts has Mr. Stefanos Ganotis as guest performer, who urged the students to acquire social and linguistic skills in a non-formal environment. He also presented a short artistic moment and demonstrated playing the lyre, an ancient instrument used by gods.
- On returning to the hotel, the teachers' meeting was held to **evaluate the day's activities**.

Day 7 Sunday, May 12th, 2019

- At 9:00, after Energizer and breakfast, we went on a beautiful trip to **Delphi**, another important UNESCO site of Greece, and to **Galaxidi**. At breakfast we were announced that in Greece they celebrate **Mother's Day** on the **12th of May**. On the way to Delphi, the Greek students told us about the customs related to this day and also about the wonderful Delphi, which is considered "the navel of the world".
 - At **Delphi** the students got lots of information, asked questions and received answers, took









many photos, individually, in teams and groups.

- Lunch was served on the beach, at the "Scala" **Greek tavern** in Galaxidi. After lunch the students explored the beach, **played** and took a lot of **photos**.
- Dinner was at 20:00, after which the children had time to socialize, play, share experience in sign language, take photos together.
 - The teachers' meeting and evaluation took place as planned, from 21:00hrs to 22:00hrs.

> Day 8

Monday, May 13th, 2019

• At 8:30, after Energizer and breakfast, the morning activities began with **practising the Erasmus camp song**, under the teachers' supervision.



- After a short break, the day's program continued with **Lesson 7** and **Lesson 8**, about the UNESCO Heritage of each country.
- Next, the program included practising the **traditional dances** in the schoolyard, under the teachers' coordination,, together the other students from the host school, who joined the camp participants.
- We had lunch at the "Pepinos" **Greek tavern**, with traditional foods specific to the host country.
- In their spare time, the students filled in their camp journals, then took **photos of nature** and **group photos**.
 - In the afternoon, we went to the **Mall** in Athens, where the students could buy things for themselves and their families. We had dinner here, too.
- On returning to the hotel, the teachers met for the **evaluation of the day's activities** and to discuss the next day's program

<u>Day 9</u> Tuesday, May 14th, 2019

• At 8:30, after Energizer and breakfast, the morning activities comprised Lesson 9 from




- 8:30 to 9:30 and **Lesson 10** from 9:30 to 10:30; the teams worked by rotation, so that the same lesson was presented to another team, until all five teams came to know the UNESCO Heritage of all the five countries (Poland, Portugal, Romania, Turkey, Greece).
- After a short break, students had **the arts** and **crafts workshops**, where each group coordinator presented the technique to make a product specific country of the country he belonged to, after which the product was made by the students in each group, under the coordination





of the group leader: Poland – the purple team – Chains decorations, Romania – the orange team – Book marks, Greece – the blue team - Bracelets, Portugal – the green team – Origami, Turkey – the red team – Ebru.

- After lunch, offered by the host school, the students continued to write in the **camp journals**.
 - The afternoon continued with **traditional dances** presented by the students of each project
 - partner institution and then performed by the students in each group, under the coordination of the group leader: Kalamatianos Greece, La Polonnaise Poland, Regadinho– Portugal, Braşoveanca Romania, Haby– Turkey.
 - The evening ended with a party where traditional dances combined with modern music and dances.





• At the **evening meeting**, the teachers analyzed the day's activities and discussed the next day's program.

> <u>Day 10</u>

Wednesday, May 15th, 2019

• After Energizer and breakfast at 8:30, the morning activities began with practising the



- **Erasmus camp song**, under the supervision of the teachers.
- After a short break, the day's program continued with the **traditional dances** specific to each country, under the supervision of the teachers.
- After rehearing the Erasmus camp song and the traditional dances, for the evening's closing ceremony, we went out to have lunch at a tavern.
- After lunch, the students resumed filling in their camp journals. The students and accompanying teachers received the **Questionnaires for the final evaluation** of the mobility, which contained questions about the activities carried out at this camp.
- At 18:00hrs we held the **closing festivity of the camp activities** in the second camp belonging to the project EUROPE'S FRIENDS, at the Cultural Center in Anoixis, Greece. Teachers from the school, parents and prominent persons from Anoixis attended the festivity. Mrs. Grammatiki Palamouti, coordinator of the project in Greece, made an evaluation of the activities during the 10 days in the camp and thanked to the teachers and students for the dedication they showed in carrying out the activities.
- Mrs. Eleni Kremmyda, school principal, and Mr. Dionysios Zamanis, Mayor of Anoixis, took the floor to thank participant countries in the project and to Romania, the coordinator country, who made this project possible.
- The students from Greece offered the audience a **farewell show**. After that, we sang the **Erasmus camp song** and performed the **traditional dances** of each project partner institution and, finally, all students danced together.

















- The teams (red, purple, blue, green and orange) and their coordinators were awarded prizes.
- The festivity ended with the granting of **Certificates of camp participation**, for the teachers and students from each partner country, by the school principal, Mrs. Eleni Kremmyda and Mrs. Dionysios Zamanis.









• The evening was finalized with a **farewell party**, where they served **traditional food specific to Greece**, prepared by the students' parents. The teachers and students from the partner countries took leave from one another with great emotion and tears in their eyes. They wrote messages on one another's caps, hugged and cried together, wishing the camp would never end.



> Day 11

Thursday, May 16th, 2019

- After breakfast, the national teams from Romania, Poland, Turkey and Portugal **left the "Anoixi" camp hotel**, in Anoixi, Greece, for the airport. The camp has left strong impressions upon both the teachers and the students.
- The camp has been an occasion for the students to interact, to knoweach other better, to share experience and to find solutions to the difficulties they meet everyday. They have benefitted by a different kind of therapy in order to acquire knowledge and socializing skills, to develop language, to get personal autonomy skills.
- The camp in Greece has been a successful one; the children from participant countries have expressed their thanks and gratitude for having had the possibility to participate.
